What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Overseas Bonds Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Invests in international bonds and designed to reflect the return (before tax, fees and other expenses) on international bond markets of developed economies.

Total value of the fund: \$8,886,374

Number of investors in the fund: 1,695

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Overseas Bonds Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

How has the fund performed?



GST is included in the fund charges set out above.


Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$316 (that is 3.16% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$30. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$286 for the year.
