## Fund update for the quarter ended 30 September 2018

This fund update was first made publicly available on 19 October 2018.

# What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Overseas Nongovernment Bonds Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

## **Description of this fund**

The Overseas Non-government Bonds Fund is designed to provide a return (after tax, fees and other expenses) that reflects the after-tax return on international non-government bond markets of developed economies.

Total value of the fund: \$265,748

Number of investors in the fund: 13

# What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Overseas Non-government Bonds Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

## Other specific risks

There are other risks that may increase the risk to returns for investors, which are not reflected in the risk indicator. These risks include the risk that changes to the UK's rules for recognised overseas pension schemes (ROPS) limit your ability to withdraw your investments or affect the UK tax you pay on your investment. We will not be liable for any loss you may suffer if this happens.

There is also investment management risk. In particular, while the SuperLife UK pension transfer scheme's philosophy is that a passive approach to investing will deliver better long-term results, we make some active management decisions. There is a risk that this may result in the fund achieving a return that is lower than its investment objective.


# How has the fund performed?

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


# **Example of how this applies to an investor**

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$46 (that is -0.46% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$60. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$106 for the year.

# **Currency hedging**

The fund's foreign currency exposure is hedged to the New Zealand dollar, and hedging levels will vary between 90% and 110%. As at 30 September 2018, 99.43% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.
