What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Global Bond ETF Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Global Bond ETF Fund invests in the Smartshares Exchange Traded Funds' Global Bond Fund.

What are the risks of investing?

The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates.

Other specific risks

There are other risks that may increase the risk to returns for investors, which are not reflected in the risk indicator. These risks include active management risk. In particular, the investment manager for the fund buys and sells financial products based on its own assessment of what is happening in the market. There is a risk that the investment manager selects investments that result in the fund achieving a return that is lower than the investment objective for the fund.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

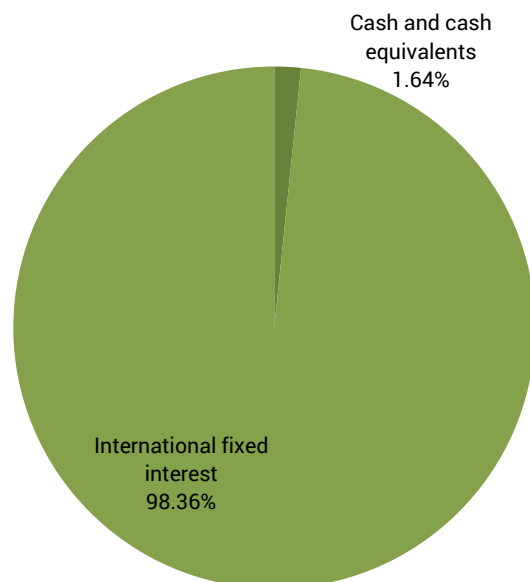
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$468 (that is 4.68% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12 (Jess received statements and other SuperLife communications electronically and was not charged the paper statements fee). This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$456 for the year.
