### Fund update for the quarter ended 31 December 2020

This fund update was first made publicly available on 16 February 2021.

### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SuperLife High Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Smartshares Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### Description of this fund

Invests in growth assets and designed for investors that want an aggressive investment option that invests in shares and property. Negative annual returns may occur once in every 2 - 4 years on average.

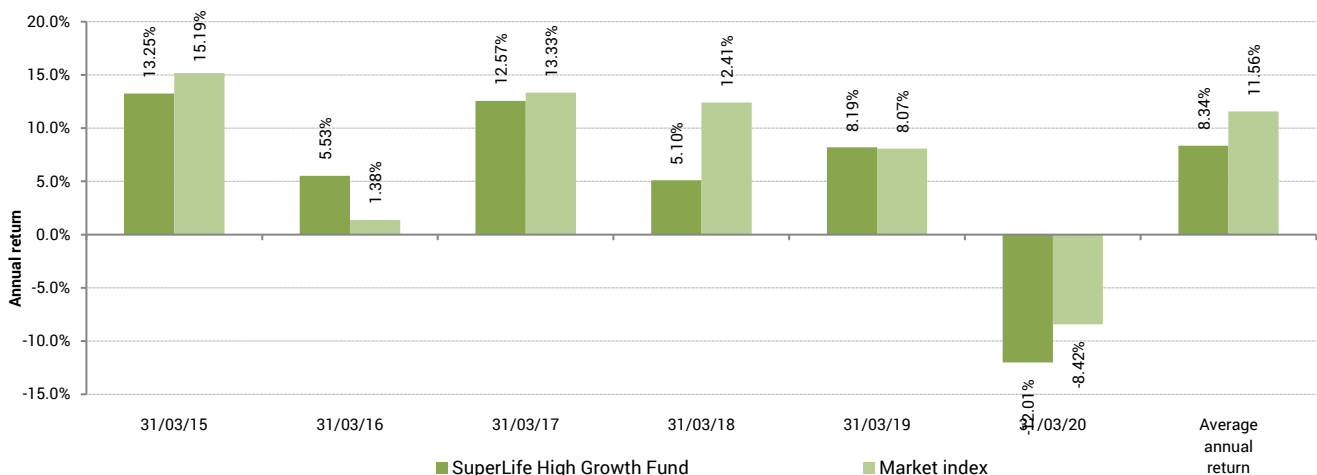
### What are the risks of investing?

#### Risk indicator for the SuperLife High Growth Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

### How has the fund performed?

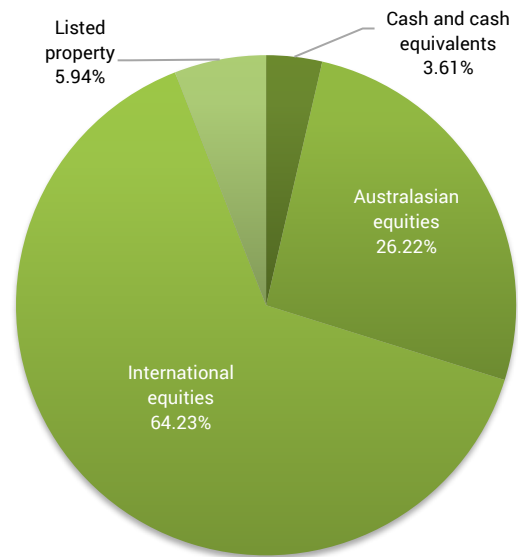
### Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$528 (that is 5.28% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total return after tax of \$516 for the year.

## Currency hedging

The fund's foreign currency exposure is hedged to the New Zealand dollar. The target hedging level is 73%. The actual hedging level can be anywhere in the 0% - 120% range. As at 31 December 2020, 70.63% of the fund's foreign currency exposure was hedged.
