What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Australian Financials Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Australian Financials Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

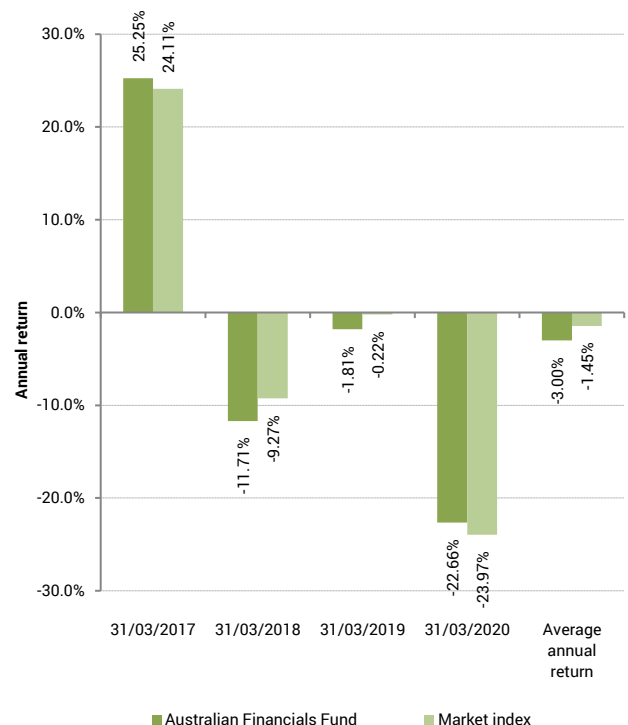

How has the fund performed?

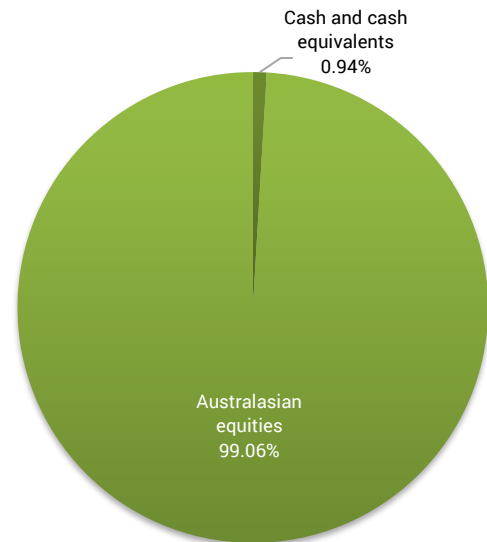
Example of how this applies to an investor

Jess had \$10,000 in the fund and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jess received a return after fund charges were deducted of -\$2,622 (that is -26.22% of her initial \$10,000). Jess paid other charges of \$12. This gives Jess a total loss after tax of -\$2,634 for the year.
